In the 34 counties served by the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina more than 500,000 individuals struggle each day to provide enough food for their families. Nearly 50% of those at risk of hunger in the 34 counties are children and seniors. The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina is able to take a \$1 donation and distribute generally \$8 worth of food or four meals.

The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina is a nonprofit organization that has provided food for people at risk of hunger in 34 counties in central and eastern North Carolina for 30 years. The Food Bank serves a network of more than 800 partner agencies such as soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters, and programs for children and adults through warehouses in Durham, Greenville, New Bern, Raleigh, the Sandhills (Southern Pines) and Wilmington. In fiscal year 2010-2011, the Food Bank distributed more than 42 million pounds of food and non-food essentials through these agencies.
