# Food Bank Summer Food and Funds Drive to Feature BBQ and Blues in Durham

'In North Carolina, barbecue is a noun, not a verb" says NC Pork Council

RALEIGH - In 2008, the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina launched a food and funds drive called Kids Summer Stock. Kids Summer Stock has provided a combined total of 3 million meals to children and their families over the past two summers. The 2010 Kids Summer Stock Food and Funds Campaign kicked off at the main warehouse on Tarheel Drive in Raleigh on Thursday, June 3. With a line up of events scheduled for the entire month of June at each of its branches, the next Kids Summer Stock event in the Triangle, called Blues, Brews and Ques, will take place on Saturday, June 5 at the Historic Durham Athletic Park. The NC Pork Council is a major sponsor of the event with nearly 20 cookers on hand cooking and preparing whole hog barbecue. Admission is just \$5 with children under 12 admitted for free.

#### THE QUES

This event is a NC Pork Council sanctioned cook off with the barbeque being judged by certified judges on the morning of June 5th at 8:30 am. As a sanctioned event, the winner will qualify to compete in the state championship in September. Several of the cookers for the Blues, Brews and Ques event are past state champions or competitors.

"This will be one of only a handful of whole hog barbecue contests that are held in the Triangle," said Ann Edmondson, Director of Marketing and Communications for the NC Pork Council. "North Carolina is the 'Home of Pork Barbecue'," said Edmondson. "In North Carolina, we say barbecue is a noun, not a verb!"

North Carolina is the second highest pork producing state in the country, contributing \$9 billion dollars to the state's economy and providing 46,000 jobs. "North Carolina's pork producers are proud to support the Food Bank by helping with the barbecue contest," said Edmondson. "We believe "our families feed your families" and this weekend we can all see that put into practice."
