## **Volunteers Needed To Help Food Bank Garden Grow**

**NEW BERN, N.C.** (July 10, 2012) –The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina at New Bern is looking for volunteers to assist Master Gardeners in the plot next to the warehouse located at 205 South Glenburnie Road. Work in the garden occurs year round and begins at 8am during summer months and 9am during the winter months.

Groups or individuals are needed Tuesday mornings for planting, watering, weeding, harvesting, and other activities. Children age 12 and up can volunteer with an adult.

The garden broke ground in September 2010 and yielded over 8,500 pounds of fresh produce in 2011 to be distributed to the New Bern Branch service area (Carteret, Craven, Jones, Onslow, and Pamlico Counties). Last month items harvested from the garden included cabbage, cucumbers, potatoes, squash, zucchini, and corn.
