Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina Donation Expands Food Bank's Ability to Serve

DURHAM, NC (September 21, 2015) – The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina will now be able to serve more people in our Durham service area thanks to a generous donation from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina (BCBSNC). The company recently provided funds which allowed the Food Bank to purchase a new 26-foot refrigerated box truck. The truck will be unveiled at a ceremony at this Durham Branch, located at 2700 Angier Avenue, this Wednesday, September 23 at 11am.

The new truck will allow the Durham Branch to make nearly 50 additional direct distributions of fresh fruits, vegetables, dairy and other items to partner agencies in the Durham service area. It will also allow for pickup of additional retail and food drive donations. "We're so thankful to Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina for continuing to be a great partner in hunger relief," said Peter Werbicki, President/CEO of the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina. "This donation amounts to more meals for those in need and ultimately a healthier community."

"Ensuring that North Carolina's hungry families have enough nutritious food to eat is central to making our state a better place to live for all of us," said Barbara Morales Burke, BCBSNC's vice president of health of health policy. "We're proud to support the Food Bank of Eastern and Central North Carolina's efforts to end hunger and we're pleased that this truck will improve lives immediately and effectively."

In the Food Bank's 34-county service area there are nearly 650,000 individuals living in food insecure households, 33% of which are children. In the six counties served by the Durham Branch (Chatham, Durham, Granville, Orange, Person, Vance), nearly 107,000 struggle with finding their next meal.
